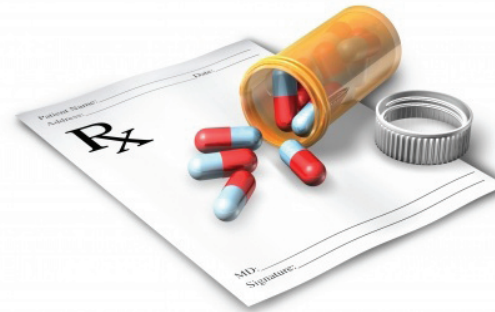

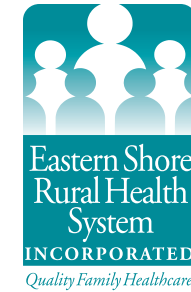

What is Medication Assistance and How Can a Caseworker Help Me?

- A Medication Assistance Caseworker can review all of your medicines and determine the least costly way to get them for you.
- After reviewing your medications the Medication Assistance Caseworker can tell you which medicines you can get through special programs offered by the drug companies* and other programs or places offering the best price for medicines not available through drug company programs.

**Some drug companies have agreed to provide certain medicines at a lower cost to help people who do not have prescription drug coverage.*

Who Qualifies?

- Must be a patient of Eastern Shore Rural Health System, Inc.
- Patients who qualify are usually on sliding fee or have no prescription insurance.

How do I get started?

- Tell your doctor that you need help paying for your medicines. Your doctor will refer you to the Medication Assistance Caseworker.
- Call the Medication Assistance Caseworker to set up a meeting. Bring proof of income (1040 Federal tax forms and recent pay stubs).
- If you qualify, the Medication Assistance Caseworker will submit an application to the drug company for approval. This could take 8 to 10 weeks.

How do I get medications?

- The Medication Assistance Caseworker will let you know when and where to pick up your prescription.

What about refills?

- It can take another 6 to 8 weeks for refills. Please call and make an appointment with your Medication Assistance Caseworker six weeks after you receive your medicines to order a refill.

What does it cost?

- You will pay \$5.25, for each medicine, at the time you order the medicine. Usually you will receive a three month supply of medication for this charge.
